The PE and Sport Premium

The Primary PE and Sports Premium funding is additional funding to schools provided by the government that is specifically targeted at improving the provision of physical education and sport. It is their belief that the funding will ensure pupils leaving primary school will be physically literate with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. The funding has been ring fenced until 2020. During 2017-18 Altrincham CE Primary school will receive £18,600.

Schools are required to use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport offered.

The premium must be used to:

- develop or add to the PE and sports activities that school offers already
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people ages 5-18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes is to be in school
- the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport

PE & Sport at Altrincham CE Primary School

The school currently holds the 'Bronze' Sainsbury's School Games Kitemark. The children are taught through the national curriculum programme of study and have access to a number of competitive and non competitive sporting opportunities at an intra and inter school level. We were proud to field different teams over different sports in tournaments last year and walk away with a team trophy at the Manchester Harriers League Team Relays in March 2017.

The school also provides extensive extra-curricular sports programme which gives the children the opportunity to access different sports throughout the year.
